GM Foundation Donates \$75,000 to Seven St. Louis Area Organizations through Plant City Grants Program

Foundation funding in support of community totals more than \$700,000 over last seven years

WENTZVILLE, Mo. – The General Motors Foundation today announced grants totaling \$75,000 to seven area organizations supporting education, child welfare, community service, and environmental programs. The donation was marked by an event at Junior Achievement of Greater St. Louis' headquarters, led by team members of GM's Wentzville Assembly.

The GM Foundation's total funding in support of the St. Louis community totals more than \$700,000 over the last seven years.

"This year, the GM Foundation will provide more than \$1.7 million in funding to 209 organizations in 45 plant cities where GM employees live and work," said GM Foundation President Vivian Pickard.
